

CONSTRUCTION - WOOD OCCUPATIONS (SITE), LEVEL 2 APPRENTICESHIP

Overview

Apprenticeships allow you to gain qualifications whilst working - you will normally study one day per week in college and spend the rest of the week at work, usually at least 30 hours per week.

The apprenticeship will equip you with the skills in health and safety, knowledge of building methods, interpretation of working drawings, setting out of masonry structures and cavity and solid walling.

In some occupational areas apprentices would be expected to work at height and outside in all seasonal weather conditions. You are likely to need a suitable level of physical fitness to perform some aspects of the job (moving and handling resources, placing and fixing materials).

You could also be expected to travel to sites or in some cases, stay in lodgings whilst working away from home.

You will also spend time at Kendal College gaining your NVQ, Technical Certificate and Functional Skills.

You will cover the following:

- General Workplace Safety
- Efficient Working Practices
- Move & Handle Resources

Three optional units will also be taken from the following:

- Install First Fixing Components
- Install Second Fixing Components
- Erect Structural Carcassing Components
- Maintain Non-Structural Carpentry Work
- Set Up & Use Circular Saw

The assessment requirements set for this qualification are multiple choice knowledge tests and practical assignments. The knowledge assessment is designed to be taken on a computer using the CSkills Awards online testing platform. The tests are externally set and marked multiple-choice tests where learners can choose one of four possible answers. The tests cover the learning outcomes for each unit and measures that they have been met by the learners.

How will I be assessed?

Entry requirements

There are no formal entry requirements, but to take this course you should be employed in the relevant role and have a passion and basic understanding of the construction sector.

You must be employed for a minimum of 30 hours a week in the professional area that your Apprenticeship is in (if you are looking for employment see below for information).
