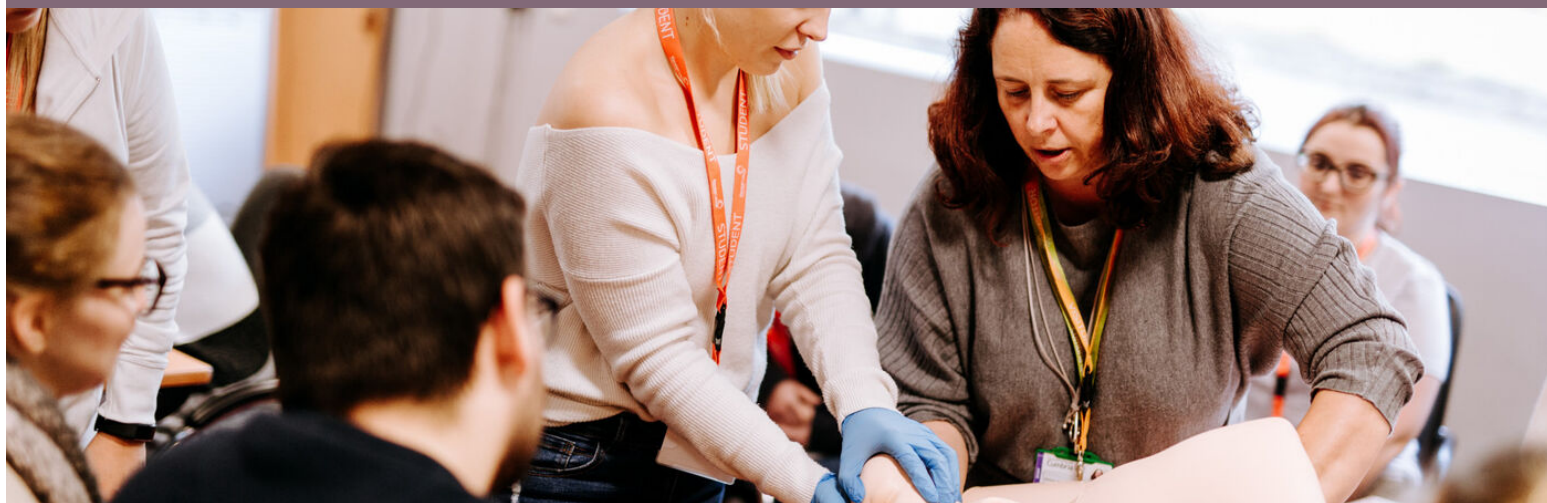


# ACCESS TO HE: POLICING & CRIMINOLOGY

## Course Overview

It is a full 2 days a week to gain the qualifications to enter university or a higher level apprenticeship within the police force and universities.

Some of the modules you will be taught - Crime Scene Investigation, Police Ethics and Values, Introduction into Psychology, Crime and Deviance and Introduction into Criminology and essential study skills.

Enrichment days to local Universities and preparation into applying and interview techniques.

The course enables adult learners to return to study and gain the knowledge and skills, along with confidence necessary for successful undergraduate study.

You will be assessed in a variety of formats including, essays, reports, workbooks, leaflets, presentations and controlled assessments.

## Entry Requirements

Expectation for the students to have GCSE or equivalent in Literacy or Numeracy grade 4 (or equivalent) or above or at least one.

## After your course

This can lead into; Policing, criminology, Policing and Forensics, Criminology and Law, Criminology and Psychology, Sociology with criminology and a wide range of combined and related degrees.

## Courses Fees

### Entry Level, Level 1 & Level 2 Courses

You may qualify for financial support to cover the cost of a government-funded qualification if any of the below apply to you:

- Have an annual salary of less than £18,525
- Receive an eligible means-tested benefit e.g. JSA, ESA or Universal Credit
- Are aged 16-18 on 31/08/22 and are not studying at another school/college
- Are aged 19 or over on 31/08/22 and do not already have a Level 1, 2 or 3 qualification
- Have a household income under £35,000 and are in financial hardship
