Course Overview

Classes include lectures supported by hand-outs, tutor demonstration and worked examples. This is followed by students working practical examples to apply new techniques and practices in preparation for the exam and the workplace.

The units include Advanced Bookkeeping, Final Accounts Preparation, Management Accounting: Costing and Indirect Tax (VAT). Each unit is assessed by a computer-based exam followed by a synoptic exam (which also includes Ethics and Spreadsheets) at the end of the course.

Entry Requirements

Entry requirements are the successful completion of the AAT Foundation Certificate in Accounting (Level 2) at a minimum of a merit grade or relevant industry experience. Please contact a tutor to discuss the most appropriate course for you.

You will need to register as a member of AAT to sit the exams. The cost of this is circa 130 pounds.

Your enrolment will include the first sitting for all exams. Any resit will be subject to a fee of circa 45 pounds.

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After your course

There are wide and varied career opportunities for AAT students including accountant or assistant accountant, finance assistant, payroll clerk, credit controller and bookkeeper. Accounting is also a useful skill for someone in a general business management role. This course is also suitable for someone who is looking to undertake the bookkeeping for a family business.

On successful completion of AAT Advanced Diploma in Accounting (Level 3), there is the opportunity to progress to AAT Professional Diploma in Accounting (Level 4).

- Aged 19+ on Functions Skills or GCSE English or Maths
- Unemployed and in receipt of JSA/ESA(WRAG)/Universal Credit or another eligible state benefit on an Entry Level, Level 1 or Level 2 course
- Member of a low income household & in financial hardship on an Entry Level, Level 1 or Level 2 course
