Principles, practices and legislation for the Initial Verification and Certification of Electrical Installations:

This qualification helps you to develop the knowledge and practical skills needed to professionally design and install or inspect and test electrical installations. This includes learning outcomes about safe isolation, inspection, safe testing, pre-energised and energised tests; documentation and the practical use of test equipment.

There is a multiple choice online assessment and a half day practical assessment.

# Entry Requirements

This award is ideal for qualified electricians wishing to update their knowledge of electrical installation techniques. Level 3 is ideal if you are a qualified electrician and have a great deal of technical skills and knowledge. You work with minimum supervision and have a good record of safety, fault correction and ensuring work meets the required standard. You want to update your knowledge of techniques and legislation.
